2011

NMCNE became an Associate Member of the NM Nursing Education Consortium. NMCNE co-leads NM Action Coalition, Future of Nursing, Campaign for Action. Hosted a statewide preceptor conference.

2010

Partnered with Idaho State University to provide rural nurse residency program. Hosted HM 50 Task Force: "Statewide Plan for Nursing Education."



2009

The first statewide faculty conference was held (annual event). The Nursing Council of New Mexico was created. Hosted House Joint Memorial 40 Task Forces with NM Board of Nursing: "Impact of a Shortage of Nursing Instructors on the Status of nursing in NM." Revised "Standards for Differentiated Competencies of the Nursing Workforce at Time of entry to Practice."



2007

NMCNE conducted workforce research in partnership with the UNM Bureau of Business and Economic Research.



2008

The first Executive Assistant is hired - NMCNE's hires its first full time employee! In partnership with the NM Board of Nursing and New Mexico First, hosted 6 town halls around the state to prioritize recommendations and establish an action plan for nursing.

2006

NMCNE has an office! Our first leadership course is presented. The first CTI Director is hired (part time).



2005

Our first Executive Director is hired! NMCNE hosts its first New Mexico Nursing Excellence Awards and presents its first preceptor course. The Clinical Teaching Institute (CTI) is established.



2004

Partnered with NM National League for Nursing to administer Nightingale Scholarships (annual event)

2003

The New Mexico Center Nursing Excellence is official; incorporation papers finalized and bylaws are adopted. The NM Consortium for Nursing Workforce Development addressed the NM Nursing Statewide Shortage Strategy Session (NS4) when it called for the establishment of Center for Nursing Excellence.

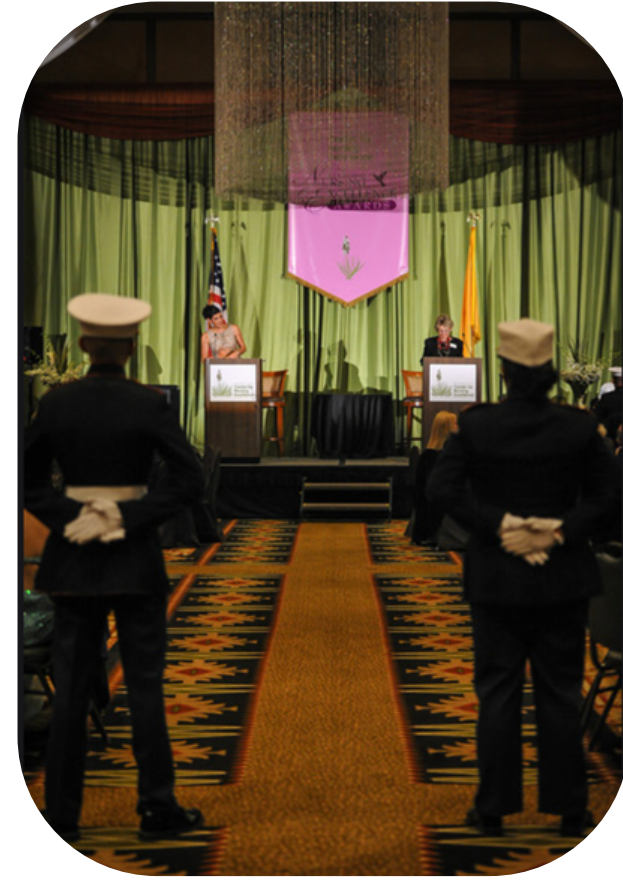
